

**TOWN OF FREDERICK, COLORADO
ORDINANCE NO. 1239**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF FREDERICK, COLORADO,
AMENDING CHAPTER 4, ARTICLE IX FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR
COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS**

WHEREAS, THE Board of Trustees, finds it in the best interests of the community to amend the provisions of the municipal code regarding Financial Support for Community Organizations.

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF
FREDERICK, COLORADO, AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. Chapter 4, Article IX of the *Frederick Municipal Code* is hereby repealed in its entirety and reenacted to read as follows:

ARTICLE IX

Financial Support for Community Organizations

4-181 Eligibility.

Applicants shall be Non-profit organizations registered with the Colorado Secretary of State as such or a qualified 501(c)(3)tax-exempt organization as recognized by the Internal Revenue Service. Taxing authorities may not apply; however, groups such as PTOs, booster clubs and athletic teams may apply under the umbrella of their respective schools. A preponderance of the members of the organization should be residents of the Town

4-182 Procedure.

The Application shall conform to the separately published "Submission Guidelines". Applicants may be asked to appear before the Board of Trustees before a decision is made. The Board of Trustees may appoint a committee to make recommendations on the awarding of support. (Ord. 730 §1, 2004, Ord. 923 §1, 2007)

4-183 Criteria.

All applications for financial support will be reviewed based upon how well the stated purpose serves the Town's citizenry in the following areas:

- (1) Number of individuals benefited in the community.
- (2) Financial need.
- (3) Positive image for the Town.

- (4) Availability of other sources of funds.
- (5) General public good. (Ord. 730 §1, 2004)

4-184 Source of funds.

The source of funds is the interest from the Oil Royalty Trust Fund. (Ord. 730 §1, 2004, Ord. 923 §1, 2007).


Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be published and become effective as provided by law.

Section 3. Severability. If any part, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections of the ordinance. The Town Board hereby declares that it would have passed the ordinance including each part, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that one or more parts, sections, subsections, sentence, clauses or phrases are declared invalid.

Section 4. Repealer. All ordinances or resolutions and motions of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Frederick or parts thereof, in conflict with this ordinance are to the extent of such conflict hereby superseded and repealed, provided that such repealer shall not repeal the repealer clauses of such ordinance, resolution or motion, nor revive any ordinance, resolution or motion thereby.
